OPENING OBSERVATIONS

- > Christ's sheep ought to talk more about their Shepherd's constant care.
- The health and productiveness of a sheep is dependent on the Shepherd's care.
- If a child of God needs 'restoration' how much if still in your sins.
 - how is it evident that I am 'still in my sins?'
 - what does the Shepherd command all men everywhere?
- The sheep of Ps. 23 is a saved sinner who yet needs restoration

THE SHEPHERD RESTORING HIS SHEEP

- I. Sheep often need restoration II. The shepherd knows how to restore them
- I. SHEEP OFTEN NEED RESTORATION
- A. Sheep are well known for getting into trouble: how?
 - 1. Usually not due to the shepherd's care
 - 2. Often let their feelings guide them (like the "Judas' goat")
 - 3. Often get themselves 'cast down' in comfortable looking places
 - a. how do sheep get cast?
 - b. what sheep are most likely to become 'cast'?
 - ullet those who are self-indulgent lazy
 - those who have become too fat

• those who get too much wool

II. THE SHEPHERD KNOWS HOW TO RESTORE THEM

- A. All restoration comes from the Shepherd
 - 1. the good shepherd is always looking out for wandering or cast sheep
 - what fills the heart of the searching shepherd?
 - are you reading what lives in the Shepherd's heart?
- B. There are various ways in which the shepherd restores his sheep
 - 1. First He seeks them out (Luke 15:3-7)
 - 2. Upon finding the 'cast' sheep, the shepherd always deals gently (Gal. 6:1-2)
 - 3. Seeing his lost and entangled sheep, he might leave them briefly (Is. 30:18)
 - 4. Seeing too much wool, he will shear them (Hebrews 12:5-12)

CLOSING OBSERVATION:

- ➤ God's revelation of His Shepherd's character is greatest ground of hope!
- Hear and obey the Shepherd's call and commitment:

O Israel, return unto the LORD thy God; for thou hast fallen by thine iniquity. Take with you words, and turn to the LORD: Say unto him,

Take away all iniquity, and receive us graciously: So will we render thee the calves of our lips. Asshur shall not save us.

I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely,
I will be as the dew unto Israel.
