Opening comments

- Habits begin like cobwebs but most end like cables
- Though we cultivate many bad habits, one is the worst of all

THE SHEPHERD'S LEADING OF HIS SHEEP

- I. Sheep need constant leading
- II. The shepherd leads his sheep into the best pasture along the best path

I. THE SHEEP NEED CONSTANT LEADING

- A. It is myth that sheep can get along anywhere by themselves
 - 1. when left to themselves, they will die due to bad habits
 - 2. when left sheep easily wander into places from where they can't return

II. THE SHEPHERD LEADS HIS SHEEP INTO THE BEST PASTURES ALONG THE BEST PATH

- A. How does the shepherd deals with these destructive tendencies in his sheep?
 - 1. He keeps his sheep on the move
 - a. this moving isn't random but carefully pre-determined
 - b. so God knows how to keep His people moving (Rom. 8:28)
 - 2. He leads his sheep to right pasture along the right paths (John 10:9)
 - a. the best grazing areas may be hard to reach
 - b. Chief Shepherd knows how to lead each sinner to best pasture
 - What is the 'best pasture' for us sinners?
 - There is only one right path to come to the best pasture

- B. What is that right and only path that leads to God?
 - 1. Defined as the path of righteousness
 - a. what is righteousness?
 - something we once possessed
 - something we desperately need
 - something we can't bring forth anymore of ourselves
 - b. we need God's leading from wrong path to the right paths
 - wrong rut of law-obedience
 - wrong rut of self-improvement
 - wrong rut of poverty-appeal
 - 2. Path of Righteousness is the Shepherd Himself (Ps. 22)
 - a. Jesus is the LORD our Righteousness (Jer. 23:5-6; 51:10
- C. How does He lead His sheep into the path of righteousness?
 - 1. by showing how each other path leads to death/damnation
 - 2. by revealing Himself as only name only path only door for sinners
 - 3. by empowering your soul to come and to confess Him as only hope!
- D. Why does He lead His sheep into these paths?
 - 1. There is one sole reason: For His Name's sake (Rom. 11:36)
