THE VOICE OF GOD IN THE PROPHETS

- > Through the prophets God shares His inner thoughts and feelings
- Malachi calls to repentance a decayed church
- ➤ His message then is God's message today

THE COMING OF THE LORD

I. FEARFUL FOR THE WICKED II. JOYFUL FOR THE GOD-FEARING

I. THE COMING OF THE LORD IS FEARFUL FOR THE WICKED

- A. The 'wicked' defined (Ps. 50)
 - 1. Malachi's preaching is directed to *church attenders* (1:6-8)
 - 2. Malachi's preaching was received with unbelief (1:7; 2:14; 2:17; 3:7, 8)
 - 3. Malachi's prophecy is very relevant to us church-going people a. true godliness is miles away from being religious
 - b. true godliness is tender holiness
 - holiness is to live like Christ-like
 - holiness is pure love and living above the world while in it
 - 4. Malachi's wicked are unrepentant and unbelieving church goers
- B. The message: Jesus is coming! (3:1-2; 4:1)
 - 1. Malachi's audience was eagerly anticipating Him (3:1)
 - 2. Yet God warns that His coming is a solemn reality
 - a. for God hasn't changed His character of holiness (4:4-6)
 - b. for Jesus' coming will be refining judgment (3:2-3) and a consuming fire (4:1)
 - this is 'bad news' for wicked proud self-centered unholy
 - examine yourself today!
 - 3. Don't sleep on foolishly if you falsely at ease in Zion!

II. THE COMING OF THE DAY OF THE LORD IS JOYFUL FOR THE GOD-FEARERS

- A. Why did Malachi prophesy this part of Jesus' coming?
- B. True God-fearers do not need to fear His coming
 - 1. Who are the true God-fearers?
 - a. the fear of God defined
 - it is the fruit of being known of God and knowing Him
 - it has a clear character of love and esteem for God
 - it is an experiential or emotional reality of one's life
 - b. the God-fearers are hungering and thirsting for righteousness
 - find a pleasure in God's holiness
 - battle with inability or powerlessness to be and do right
 - they are learning to look to Christ as their Savior (Luke 2:25, 38)
 - 2. God-fearers need not fear Jesus' coming!
 - a. lift up your weary hearts: He is coming to heal you with His salvation
 - Sun of Righteousness is *source power content of salvation*
 - b. for He comes as a Sun to finalize the healing process He began!
 - God's initial coming is to *wound humble convict*
 - Jesus' presence and future appearance is complete His work
 - c. all His healing is summed up in vs. 2b 3
