**Opening Observations:** 

- There are three kinds of desires:
  - A. Natural desires
  - B. Sinful desires
  - C. Godly desires
- > Presence of godly desires is the evidence of *regeneration*

## THE TENTH COMMANDMENT: GOD'S CALL TO BE HOLY AS GOD IS HOLY

- A. This 10<sup>th</sup> is a *reflective and deepening command* 
  - 1. Surface level has been covered in previous commandments
  - 2. Yet in 10<sup>th</sup> God goes step further as He deals with *desires* of heart a. no sinful desire is *ever to rise in our heart* 
    - b. all good desires ought to rise in our heart
    - c. God commands this in perfect measure: Matt. 5:48; 1 Peter 1:15
  - 3. Important to distinguish between the *temptation to and coveting of* a. consider Gen. 3:16; James 1:14-15; Matt. 4:10
  - 4. No human law book goes ever this deep
- B. How does that look practically in the day to day circumstances?
- C. Do you find this high standard of godliness your joy and aim of heart? 1. The 'unregenerate mind' will not (Rom. 8:7)
  - 2. The 'regenerate mind' delights in the law of the Lord (Rom. 7:22)

- D. Why hold up such a standard even the saved can't keep?
  - 1. Because Jesus did do this in all His teaching
    - a. None knew better what dwelled in human hearts
    - b. He didn't preach assume any hearer had any power in himself
    - c. Yet He demands obedience to His call and direction.
  - 2. Because Jesus preached like this because of John 6:63 *It is the Spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life.*
  - 3. Because it is the way to make Christ more precious and needed! a. Q. 114 is a pastoral answer to a beaten down hearer
    - b. when the surgical knife of God's law sinks into depths of your evil heart the more you are driven away from self to Christ!
  - 4. Because it is the Spirit's way of cultivating godliness (Titus 2:14-15)

**CLOSING CAUTION**: Never mix the foundation with building stones!
