SCRIPTURE READING: EXODUS 20:1-17 & ROMANS 8 TEXT: Ps. 23:5B

SINGING: 111:1-4 - 144:1, 2 - 297:1-3 - 6:1-6 - 52:1-4

Observation: No animal resembles us more than a sheep!

- Once a sheep is lost, it is unable to find its way back
- A sheep by itself is seldom clean and can't clean itself
- None is more defenseless than a sheep

## THE SHEPHERD'S ANOINTING OF HIS SHEEP

- I. Why does He need to anoint them? II. How does He anoint them? III. What is result of this anointing?
- I. Why does the Shepherd need to anoint them?
- A. Though 'table lands' are wonderful, the reality there can be torturous
  - 1. summer time is 'fly-time'
  - 2. summer time 'scab time'
- B. Shepherd's care in anointing His sheep is to defend and heal them
  - 1. Without the shepherd every sheep doomed to dreadful torture & death! a. this is the picture of lost mankind: Is. 57:20-21 Ps. 32:10 Ps. 16:4
    - b. yet God's sheep are not exempt from the 'fly and scab season'
      - though justification is complete, sanctification is not
      - though a new heart is given, the old heart is still troubling
         Rom 7:12-24
- II. How does He anoint them?
- A. The shepherd uses a mixture with oil and applies it to affected areas
- B. 'Anointing oil' is the supreme symbol of the Holy Spirit's ministry
  - 1. Compare Romans 8:1, 2, 5, 13, 23, 26, 27
  - 2. As sheep can't apply the oil themselves, so we can't either

- 3. All glory of salvation belongs to Father and Son through the Holy Spirit a. He is the Comforter Spirit of power, grace, truth
  - b. He sheds abroad the love of God into heart
  - c. He strengthens faith in its exercise to overcome world
  - d. He fills with joy and peace in believing
  - e. He helps us in our prayers as we know not what and how to pray
- C. Real sheep don't seek the anointing of shepherd but we are expected to seek!
  - 1. Consider Paul's exhortations in 1 Thess. 5:17-23; Col. 3:16; Phil 4:8
    - a. the Word of God washes and cleanses and renews (Ps. 119)
    - b. the Sacraments are His means to strengthen (1 Cor. 11:25)

## III. WHAT IS THE RESULT OF THIS ANOINTING?

- A. David confessed what this anointing does to a believer: my cup runneth over
  - 1. Where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty to confess and sing (Ex. 15) a. consider David's Psalms running over his cup of joy: Ps. 34, 40
  - 2. The cup only runs over because He fills it more than full!
    - a. shepherds always carried a bottle of 'strong potion' to revive sheep
    - b. in order to give it, the shepherd needed to remain alert, be with them and act quickly
  - 3. So when 'our cup overflows' it is again a tribute to the Shepherd!

## Consider ...

- A. The Shepherd is our midst *seeking searching calling reaching* lost sheep!
  - 1. Fear not to answer Him when He calls you in the Gospel or warns you in His law: His intent is not evil not to harm but to seek and save!

For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved. John 3:17
