CITY OF REFUGE

I. THE NEED FOR A CITY OF REFUGE

- A. We aren't only *un-intentional* sinners but all are also *intentional* sinners
 - 1. Daily we stumble due to our fallen nature, but none are excused!
 - 2. Daily we also make deliberate choices that violate God's moral code!
- B. The reality is that God is our Judge and the Avenger of every wrong!
 - 1. Who can blame God for pursuing justice?
 - 2. Who can meet this Judge of every heart and life?

II. THE PROVISION OF THE CITY OF REFUGE

- A. Upon God's command, Moses set aside 6 cities for refuge
- B. The provision of city of refuge is God's 'self-revelation'
 - 1. The OT revelation provided a refuge place for *un-intentional sinners!*
 - 2. The NT revelation deepens it to a refuge place for *intentional sinners!*
- C. God doesn't cancel His demand of justice but provides way of settlement 1. In the cross of Jesus the Judge can embrace the sinner (Ps. 85:1)
 - 2. In the Gospel the Judge invites us 'come and eat' (Luke 14:16-17) a. the foundation of God's Gospel is His sovereign grace
 - b. the door of God's Gospel is His free grace

III. THE USE OF THE CITY OF REFUGE

- A. What good are all the cities if the guilty wouldn't flee to it?
- B. Observe how David makes use of the 'city of refuge' in Ps. 31:1
 - 1. Definition of 'trust' is to seek or take refuge
 - 2. His plea not 'to be put to shame'
 - a. each applicant for 'refuge-status faced a trial (Nu. 35:24)
 - b. depending on facts, you either were given or denied protection
 - 3. His ground to be admitted shelter even though he was an intentional sinner was *not his own righteousness*

CLOSING THOUGHTS:

- A. The promise of the Gospel is 'full coverage' in Jesus' righteousness
 - 1. How necessary to part with your own 'coverage'
 - 2. Be assured that God is reconcilable (Heb. 6:18)
