I. TO WHOM DO THE ANGEL BRING THE MESSAGE 'FEAR NOT'

- A. Good angels are God's servants serving in numerous ways!
 - 1. They serve in rejoicing about God's work (Job 38:7)
 - 2. They serve in defending access to Tree of life (Gen. 3:24)
 - 3. They rejoiced seeing Jesus stoop into human nature (Luke 2:14)
 - 4. They rejoice to see another sinner honoring God (Luke 15:10)
- B. Around the coming of Jesus Christ, the angel's visits increased
 1. Zachariah Mary Joseph shepherds seeking women
 a. common message to them all: *Fear not!*
 - 2. But they are not sent to all men with this message of 'Fear not' a. not to the world of unconcerned sinners (Luke 12:14)
 - b. but to the god-fearers in the world: what are they like?
 - c. yet these God-fearers often wrestle with Mr. Fearful within.
- C. Are you one of those *who fear God yet walk in darkness?*1. Do experience much opposition of Mr. Fearful and his company?
 - 2. The angel's message is the god-fearers: Fear Not!
 - 3. The opposite message is true for all who don't fear God!

 1. Because God's sending of His Son displays riches of His grace!

b. isn't the issue of His justice not the *real cause* of the fears?

APPLICATION:

- A. 'Fear not' trembling sinner: Behold, I bring your glad tidings!
 - 1. He was born in Bethlehem in order to die on Golgotha
 - a. His death answered the hardest question: *How can a just God let a guilty sinner go free?*
 - b. the answer is *Fear Not for God made in Christ the provision in which He can be both just and yet the justifier of the guilty!*
